
FIND YOUR WAY HOME

This year's theme is "Find Your Way Home", which translates to "Tìm Đường Về" in Vietnamese. Identities we have in our daily lives help us to decide communities we partake in. Throughout Asian American history, the need for survival has pressed us to abandon cultural traditions in order to acculturate. Sometimes, it is easy to take what we have for granted and stay in a comfort zone our whole lives. Discovering new parts of culture can make for growth as you can push yourself into a learning edge. The story behind "Find Your Way Home" demonstrates how people are able to develop themselves in history and culture— and how the Vietnamese Student Association at the University of Michigan strives to cultivate a community that prospers together in all ways.

ONE BODY VILLAGE

This year all proceeds from DVN will go towards the *One Body Village*, a nonprofit organization. This organization aims to rescue, restore, and rebuild the lives of sexually exploited children in Southeast Asia. One Body Village's name was derived from an African proverb, "It takes a village to raise a child", which means that it takes an entire community of different people interacting with children in order for a child to experience and grow in a safe environment.
