THIS YEAR'S THEME

This year's theme is "A Whole New World", which translates to "Một Thế Giới Hoàn Toàn Mới" in Vietnamese. We spend the majority of our lives trying to define who we are. Social identities play a crucial role in the communities we participate in.

This is especially true in Asian American history as the need for survival has forced us to choose between assimilation or cultural pride, turning nuanced conversations about identity into competitions about authenticity.
